

SCHOOL THE WORLD







Fifteen years ago, I found myself standing atop a mountain in Chichicastenango, Guatemala, looking at what was called a school—a fragile structure of wood and metal, a dirt floor, a simple blackboard leaning against the "wall," and tree stumps serving as makeshift chairs. The mayor who had brought me there said plainly, "We need schools."

I listened and thought about all the children I had seen around the world who had so little yet carried so much hope in their eyes. That day, I made an offer: "How about you pay for half, and we pay for half?" With no blueprint, no roadmap—just an unwavering belief that education could change everything — the first stone of School the World was laid.

From a single promise has grown something extraordinary. In 15 years, we built 162 schools and 91 playgrounds across three countries. We directly served more than 40,000 students through our schools, early childhood centers, and scholarship programs. We empowered 11,740 parents, trained 8,275 teachers, and created 945 classroom libraries—ensuring that learning extends beyond classrooms into homes and communities. Together, all these initiatives have impacted **170,847 children** living in extreme poverty with the promise of education.

Last November, for the second year in a row, the leading think tank and education convener HundrED.org selected our high-dose tutoring program as one of the 100 most effective and scalable educational innovations in the world. The Library of Congress also recognized our literacy impact, particularly our approach to mobilizing mayors, community leaders, and parents to take ownership of their children's education.

Yet for every classroom we've built, 258 million children around the world still lack access to quality education. That's why we're looking ahead with "Moonshot 2030: How Great Futures Take Flight," an ambitious strategy to directly serve 84,000 children worldwide over the next five years—more than doubling our direct impact.

These past 15 years have been a testament to the power of community, resilience, and hope. None of this would have been possible without you—our supporters, partners, and volunteers who believed in this mission from the beginning or joined us along the way.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Here's to the next 15 years of changing lives.

We're setting our sights on doubling our impact, reaching twice as many children, families, and communities in just five years. 



Through this holistic approach, we don't just build schools—we cultivate empowered communities, engaged families, motivated educators, and lifelong learners who transform their world.



The early years of a child's life are critical for brain development, setting the foundation for lifelong learning and success. Launched in 2020 in Guatemala, our Early Childhood Program ensures that children aged 0 to 6 years develop essential cognitive, motor, and language skills to be ready for first grade.

How It Works

- ★ Community-Based Approach: Parents, community volunteers, and local leaders play a key role in designing the program's implementation.
- ★ Volunteer Training: Selected community members receive training in early childhood development.
- ★ Parental Engagement: Parents attend bi-monthly trainings, learning how to support their child's early learning.
- Preprimary Teacher Training: We train preprimary teachers to develop critical pre-literacy skills.
- ★ **Technical Guidance:** School the World acts as a facilitator, organizing and advising communities.

2,298 children participated in early childhood education sessions.

In 2024, the program expanded into Honduras, broadening its reach.



For years, Jennifer taught in a shared adobe classroom dark, damp, and cold. Rain would leak through the walls, students would get sick, and sometimes frogs would jump into the room. In 2023, School the World built a new classroom in her community. Bright, clean, and safe it gave Jennifer her own teaching space for the first time in her career.

Now, she decorates her classroom with pride, uses learning materials freely, and teaches with greater joy and motivation. Her students love it too: "We don't want to change classrooms next year," they tell her.

"This new classroom has changed my life as a teacher—and made learning more joyful and dignified for my students."



When parents are engaged in their children's education, students perform better and stay in school longer. Our Parent Training Program ensures that caregivers are active participants in their child's learning journey.

Over 12,000 parents across Guatemala, Honduras, and Panama have actively participated in our programs to date.

Parents are trained to become the "first educators" and advocates for their child's education.

Strengthening Education Through Proven Methodology: Teacher Training & Learning Recovery

A great education begins with well-prepared teachers and continues with timely, targeted support for students who are falling behind. At School the World, we pair teacher training with intensive tutoring—both rooted in the same evidence-based methodology—to ensure every child receives quality instruction at their level of need.

A Legacy of Impact

8,275 teachers trained to date

7,300+ students supported through tutoring

92% teacher participation rate in 2024

Both programs are built on the *Teaching at the Right Level (TaRL)* methodology —an approach originally developed in India and adapted for the local languages and educational contexts of Central America. TaRL groups students by learning level rather than age, enabling educators to meet each child where they are and guide them toward foundational literacy and numeracy.

Our **Teacher Training Program** equips educators with effective instructional tools and diagnostic strategies, empowering them to identify and respond to their students' needs in real-time. These teachers bring TaRL to life in their classrooms every day, creating learning environments where all students can grow.

Meanwhile, our **Accelerated Learning Recovery Program**—recognized as one of the 100 most impactful education interventions in the world by HundrED.org—focuses on students most affected by the pandemic's impact on education. Since 2022, trained community-based tutors have worked with over 7,300 students in Guatemala, Honduras, and Panama. Using play-based, small group sessions, they help children regain lost skills in reading and math.


By aligning both teachers and tutors around the same child-centered methodology, we foster a continuum of learning support that strengthens schools from the inside out. Teachers carry these practices forward long after our direct intervention ends, while tutors provide an immediate lifeline to students at risk of falling through the cracks.

Together, these programs build local capacity, promote student resilience, and contribute to long-term educational transformation—one classroom, one community at a time.

"Reading has made a real difference in my classroom. My students now have a broader vocabulary, use their imagination, express themselves more clearly, and even write their own stories. They're becoming confident writers.

Every morning from 7:45 to 8:15, we dedicate time to reading. This daily routine has led to noticeable improvements—not just in reading fluency and comprehension, but also in spelling and handwriting. When they come across a new word, they look it up on their own. That curiosity brings me so much joy.

Thanks to School the World's Library Program, we've received new books every year for nearly a decade. The Book Delivery creates so much excitement among students, and the collection has grown into a valuable resource that supports learning across the school.

This program has not only enriched our classrooms—it has helped parents understand the importance of reading and become more engaged in their children's education. The impact is visible, and it continues to grow.

Lower Secondary School: Expanding Educational Access

For many students, continuing their education past sixth grade is not an option due to financial or geographic barriers. To ensure that students have a path forward to continue their education, we offer scholarships to traditional secondary schools and alternative education programs for working youth to continue their education with independent study and classes once per week.

A Legacy of Impact

959 middle school scholarships awarded and 1403 alternative education students enrolled by the end of 2024.





70% of scholarships are reserved for girls, ensuring greater gender equity in education. Low dropout rate of just 4.8%, demonstrating the success of the program.



Success Story

"Before, I didn't even know what a scholarship was. Today, I'm studying Law to defend the women in my community."

At just 18 years old, Shelzy is the first in her family to attend university. She's studying law in a community where most girls don't make it past sixth grade. Her journey is one of courage and conviction. She learned to sew at age four to help support her family—today, she makes traditional blouses to fund her university studies.

Thanks to her School the World scholarship, Shelzy found a way to continue her education and, through our supplemental trainings, gain new confidence and an unwavering vision for her future.

Now, she credits School the World with her dreams of becoming a lawyer to defend women's and animals' rights in her community—and to one day sponsor a young girl just like her.

By stepping outside their comfort zones, students develop a deep appreciation for service, seeing firsthand how their work impacts children, families, and entire communities.

2024 Highlights: Service in Action

In 2024, 186 students from 9 states across the U.S. participated in service trips and worked together to build:

12 new classrooms, expanding educational opportunities for children

Multiple classroom and bathroom renovations, improving learning conditions 5 playgrounds, creating safe spaces for play and development

Through their dedication and hard work, these students left an indelible mark on the communities they served, demonstrating that one week of service can spark a lifetime of impact.

Corporate Service Trips: A Transformational Experience in Giving Back

For the past seven years, School the World's Corporate Service Program has provided professionals with an opportunity to step outside their daily routines and immerse themselves in a high-impact, hands-on service experience. These trips transcend corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives—they are deeply moving journeys that foster leadership, teamwork, and global awareness while making a tangible, lasting impact on communities in Guatemala, Honduras, and Panama.

2024 Highlights: Service in Action

In 2024, 28 participants from six companies—IMG, Flywire, Ivywise, Envisage, Allianz, and International Citizens—traveled to Cabecera de Ullama, Ngäbe Buglé, Panama, to work alongside local families and educators.

Construct 2 new classrooms, expanding educational opportunities for children Build 1 playground, creating a space for children to play and learn

Complete essential maintenance, ensuring the longevity of educational spaces The project exemplified true collaboration between corporate volunteers and local families, with community members showing extraordinary commitment to securing their children's future trough education.




