Today, School the World works in **Guatemala**, **Honduras**, Panama and Philiphines, empowering children, families, and communities to build brighter futures through education. By focusing on the root causes of poverty, we create sustainable, generational impact.

- TRAINING TEACHERS: EQUIPPING EDUCATORS WITH INNOVATIVE STRATEGIES TO ENHANCE CLASSROOM OUTCOMES.
- **PROVIDING RESOURCES:** SUPPLYING LIBRARIES, DIGITAL TOOLS, AND MATERIALS TO ENRICH LEARNING EXPERIENCES.
- SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS: SUPPORTING STUDENTS THROUGH ADOLESCENCE TO ENSURE THEY COMPLETE THEIR EDUCATION.

WHY THE PHILIPPINES

- According to the Department of Education, more than 165,000 classrooms are still missing nationwide (Philippine Star, May 28, 2025).
- Rural dropout rates remain high, and many children in Palawan and Zamboanga del Sur lack access to safe classrooms, trained teachers, and family support systems.
- This expansion is part of STW's Moonshot 2030 vision: ensuring every child completes at least 10 years of quality education.

WHERE IN PHILIPPINES

Six rural communities in:

- Palawan
- Zamboanga del Sur



WHAT WE DO



Schools: Begin with the construction of six new classrooms at the end of 2025.



Teachers: Provide ongoing training focused on literacy and student engagement.



Parents: Run structured workshops to empower families in their children's learning.



Libraries: Establish classroom libraries to nurture a culture of reading.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Fall 2025: Construction of the first six classrooms begins.
- 2026: Launch of Service Learning Program in the Philippines, starting with corporate teams.
